Hundreds of speakers help make the conference education an experience that participants won't soon forget. But, how do you know the audience is learning? Are you speaking to the participants or acting as a facilitator of learning? Check out these tips and resources to help guide your presentation.

Have a central theme (and stick to it)

Break up the lecture; include an activity every 10-15 minutes

Focus on what the audience is there for (versus what you want to tell)

Be interactive: use games, videos, worksheets, etc.

Cater to different learning styles (visual, auditory, kinesthetic, verbal, etc.)

Provide interactive handouts

Poll the audience with social media

Practice as if you don't have technology (or notes) so you'll be better prepared
